

demonstrate our thankfulness in all that we do.



At our last Voters Assembly meeting, we discussed our budget and the concerns regarding the financial well-being of the congregation. Like many churches around the country, we haven't returned to our pre-COVID attendance numbers and we have fewer people giving regularly in the collections. Our financial team's careful management has stood us in good stead and we are not in debt, however, we now face the agreeable prospect of getting a full-time pastor and that will mean a substantial increase in our financial needs.

In Malachi 3:10, God challenges us by saying, "Bring all the tithes into the store houses that there may be food in my house, and try me now in this" says the Lord of hosts, "if I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such a blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it."
