

Message from Our Pastor



The Dimensions of Discipleship

Love God. Love People. Make Disciples.

As mentioned in the last Crossroads, each month of 2025 we will look at the first part of our mission statement: **Disciples of Jesus**, Connecting our Community to Christ. A disciple of Jesus reflects God in the world. When Jesus talked about discipleship, it was an all-in kind of thing.

A large crowd was following Jesus. He turned around and said to them, "If you want to be my

disciple, you must, by comparison, hate everyone else—your father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even your own life. Otherwise, you cannot be my disciple. And if you do not carry your own cross and follow me, you cannot be my disciple.

"But don't begin until you count the cost. For who would begin construction of a building without first calculating the cost to see if there is enough money to finish

it? Otherwise, you might complete only the foundation before running out of money, and then everyone would laugh at you. They would say, 'There's the person who started that building and couldn't afford to finish it!'" – Luke 14:25-30

Perfection is not necessary to be a disciple of Jesus, but we do have to know what we are signing up for and be willing to submit all areas of life to God. As Jesus discipled people, he expected that their discipleship would touch all aspects of their life, relationships, and even society as a whole.

A real disciple needs to embrace and continually grow in all the dimensions of discipleship. We can't be ¾ of a disciple, picking and choosing, for a disciple when fully trained is like his or her teacher: Jesus (Luke 6:40). True discipleship is holistic: we can't be content to be growing in some areas and lacking in other areas.

When thinking of the nature of discipleship, we naturally look to our teacher, Jesus. As Jesus became incarnate and lived among us, we see him living a specific way. The picture attached to this article is a diagram that represents the 8 dimensions of a disciple as developed by Robert E. Logan. We will be looking into each of the 8 dimensions of a disciple over the next eight months, detailing one dimension each month.

It will be important to keep this diagram in mind and examine it to see how the pieces fit together. (I will include the diagram in subsequent articles). As you begin to understand how the pieces fit together, use it to evaluate your own life. Allow others to speak into your life as well. We never travel alone on the journey of allowing God to work in our lives.

Here are the eight dimensions of a disciple of Jesus (in case the words are too small in the diagram):

Experiencing God
Spiritual Responsiveness
Generous Living
Disciple Making
Personal Transformation
Authentic Relationships
Community Transformation

As I write on each topic, I encourage you to meet with one, two, or three other people. Discipleship is not an individual endeavor. Use the articles for discussion and encourage each other in your walk. The result will be transformation – not of ourselves only – but of others and the whole community around us.

Serving One Another

Just like in our own homes, at the church and Parish House there is always something that needs to be done. As good stewards, we are mindful of cost, level of need, and timing to complete the projects. 2025 at St. Mark started off with making great progress with respect to major projects. Two projects have been completed in the church and Parish House under the lead of Jeff Lillie.

The projects in the Parish House that have been completed includes the following: new lighting in the pastor's office, general office, youth room, and meeting room; a new floor installed in the pastor's office, general office, and meeting room; and painting of all of the downstairs rooms and the stairwell (except for the storage room). The painting crew worked hard and got the job completed in a matter of days. This work has brightened up the spaces. The office will soon be put back together and organized.



The church has a new sound system. Mike Morse and his crew drove here from the Horseheads, NY area and worked incredibly hard over the span of a week to get the project completed. As one can expect, an old building, such as the church, often presents interesting and unexpected challenges. Several individuals participated in the training on the sound system and those who could not attend may also be trained. By the time you read this there will have been at least two Sundays of worship that have been aired with the new system; hopefully, those watching online will have seen and heard a difference.

We have scheduled RG&E to come May 15th to move the church and Parish House gas meters to the outside of the buildings. The crew will be working inside and outside of the buildings throughout that day. I mention this now, so, no one plans anything at the church during that day.

The Eastern District will have its convention on June 20 - 21, 2025 in Tonawanda, NY. More information and details will be forthcoming as the convention approaches.

As we move through February, although it is the shortest month, it seems to be a big month for planning for the year. There is always something to do and ways to volunteer. As was stated in 26 January 2025 Portals of Prayers "We are not given gifts for our own sake but for the sake of the community in which God has placed us." May we each find ways to demonstrate how blessed we have been to be a blessing.
